GREENSBURG FIRE CHIEF

The safety of you, the safety to your fellow firefighter, and the safety to our residents is paramount. The goal is for everyone to go home safe and sound. Your input continues to provide us with assistance. Our monthly meetings are for you and it is an opportunity to keep you all in the loop. Each month is short and all the fire department activity does not allow for a lot of free time. City Building Tours & Pre-Planning

Building Tours were suspended for the summer months. The Pre-Planning Committee however continued to work in the development for tours to begin in October. We are updating the Seton Hill Slide Presentation which will be released to all members of the department as an attachment to the minutes of a department meeting. The documentation will be released in conjunction with a grounds tour. Further information will be release that will deal with more in depth information. Seton Hill is a very large complex. Our concentration will be on building orientation and alarm panel location in this two part release of information. We will also be visiting Pershing Square and Westmoreland Hospital over the next couple of months. Stay tune. REMINDER Safety - Over Dose Calls

Remember that even though a Safety Officer is designated, each and everyone of us need to look out for each other. We are all responsible for Safety. Not only is the fire ground a concern for us today, the drug overdose assist calls requires us to be more vigilant than ever. All overdose calls must be responded to in the required dress: Bunker Suit or Long Sleeves, Long Pants (NO SHORTS), Facemask (N-95) and NITRILE Gloves (BLUE). If you are not appropriately suited, do not enter the area. An information hand-out on Fentanyl has been issued to each company and everyone on the Dept. Mtg. E-Mail list.

Training

Assistant Chief Rick Hoyle Training Officer/Quartermaster is conducting our on-going Department Training once a month. Rick along with his appointed training committee consisting of Jeff Henry, Rob Giles, Justin Calisti, Bob Mattes, and Bill Miller continues to refine the training on an on-going basis. Training is generally scheduled for the last Monday of the Month at a designated location. The training continues to be topics that are germane to our mission serving as new to some and as a refresher for others, along with affording an opportunity for the entire department to train together as a department. 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DUTY OFFICERS

Starting in September, in agreement with the Company Captains, I have included the Company Captains in the rotating Duty Officer schedule. By including more fire department officers and affording them an opportunity to be initial responders, it will afford these officers an opportunity to develop skills that are needed in the fire service. I am hoping that Captains will build enthusiasm within their own companies and promote participation by having a crew or at the very least a driver to join him with the night of assignment. Ideally, it is not only important for someone to respond in either a POV or duty officer's vehicle; my anticipated hope is that we will see companies respond with equipment that can provide the incident with the necessary proper equipment.

Safety

All Bunker Gear involved in actual fire incidents shall undergo on-scene gross decontamination. All stations, if not already, shall have washing machines available for their members. Wash your gear regularly in accordance with the instructions that have been provided to the Captains and Companies. All personnel are responsible for their own gear.

Everyone should have two (2) Accountability Tags. There will be a collection ring on each Engine on the driver's door. If the collection ring has yet to be installed, put the tag on the driver's seat.

"HOT ZONE" PROTOCOL

All Personnel on the Fire Ground are to be wearing Gear to include: COAT, HELMET, LONG PANTS, BUNKER PANTS, PROTECTED FOOTWEAR. If it is deemed that you are unsafe, you will be asked to leave the HOT ZONE, as well as all civilians and media

.DRILL TOWER

The drill tower has recently been cleaned up inside and hosed down. The city's Electric Department has restored lights inside and the repair committee has begun to identify and fix doors, windows, and stair treads. The drill tower will remain locked at all times when not in use. There will no longer be a key at the Aerobic Center Desk. All Assistant and Deputy Assistant Chiefs and Greensburg Companies will have a key. Remember, there will be absolutely NO LIVE BURING permitted. Please use smoke bombs, fusee flares, or fog machine. Outside departments who regularly use the drill tower are still permitted to use it, however, they must coordinate use with Tony Manley for the key. Companies are requested to direct outside department requests to Tony. Do not give your key out or have copies made. Thank you to Dave Klingler, Doc Kier, Rick Hoyle, Dick Johnson, and Tony Manley for taking charge of the drill tower clean up project.

RADIO PROTOCOL

Everyone is doing well, we are definitely seeing less chatter, allowing for air space for necessary information. We need for those who are transmitting information, no matter who, to use your radio number during each and every transmission so everyone knows who is talking. We need you to remember, we are on a repeater, and if you do not allow for the repeater to open, your i.d. or message is truncated and the information that you are reporting on is useless. You are being reminded to push the transmit button, take a breath, and then give your number, and then your message. The problem of the open lapel mikes is still evident, but it is definitely better. Thank you for your cooperation.

FUTURE DRILLS

Future drills will be conducted with specific pre-planned coordinated company assignments. Drills that are conducted for facility certification will be planned to suit all companies as to not conflict with specific company obligations and events. Command on all drills will be conducted by the Chief Command Staff and Incident Safety Officers will be on hand to ensure accountability protocols are practiced. All Companies need to participate with full crews.

GRANTS

We received \$24,000 in grants to purchase extrication suites for the department. We also have received \$2,400 from the Westmoreland Hospital Employees Foundation for the purchase of gloves and hoods for inventory. We have 12 pending grants ranging from \$2,000 to \$60,000 on the department level.

In twenty minutes the team found the missing resident safe and sound. The family was very happy and donated a check to the Bloodhound Team for its appreciated efforts.

Anyone needing Radio repairs, take your radio to City Hall to the City Administrator's window. Fill out the appropriate tag with Name, Phone Number and what the problem is. Les Harvey will then pick the radio up to take to the radio vendor. There is no work done on the radios in Greensburg anymore. All High-Band radios are taken to Pittsburgh, and all 800 radios are returned to the Motorola factory for repair. Turn-around now is a lot longer. Let there be no surprises.

RETURNING BACK IN SERVICE

For Greensburg Companies, when Command requests TIMES AND NUMBERS, the incident is over. PERIOD! There is no need to report that you are "IN SERVICE RETURNING" or you never need to report "BACK IN STATION". The only exception if you had to go for fuel or get bottles filled. For mutual aid assist calls, you report "BACK IN SERVICE RETURNING" and you report "BACK IN STATION". This should all be done on City Fire. We have sent notification to mutual aid companies that assists us, and we have requested that they refrain from reporting back in service on City Fire and to simply switch to their Zone Command Channel and report their status. We are not concerned with their status once we clear them from an incident. This whole thing is to reduce unnecessary chatter from the air waves. We appreciate everyone's cooperation.

RECRUITMENT & RESPECT

Rob Giles and his committee, are putting a lot of effort in the Junior Program and he is continuing to work towards cooperative efforts with the middle schools and the senior high. The Department is improving relations with our surrounding departments in efforts to form alliances that will help fortify all of us in these days of declining responses from our older members and the lack of enough younger members standing in the wings to fill the gaps. Daytime responses are a concern, especially with specialty rescue resources. We manage but it does cause concern.
