The Greensburg Fire Department paid its final respects to a great man who for 63 years shaped the Greensburg Volunteer Fire Department into what it is today. Chief Hutchinson – Born November 13, 1921 – Died April 15, 2018. Over 100 of the members of the department participated in the Memorial Service on April 22nd at the Palace Theatre "Hutch" will be missed greatly by those who loyally served him, especially those who he mentored to, and



by a greatful community that benefitted by his unselfish contributions. It is now up to all who serve in the Greensburg Fire Department to take the initiative and follow in some very big foot prints set by a legend in the Fire industry.

Department Training

Department Training has seen continuing success. In March, 50 members of the department attended EMS ASSISTS; In April, 57 members toured First Commonwealth Bank and 38 members attended INCIDENT COMMAND REVIEW; May - all 25 of those that attended SITUATIONAL AWARENESS MATTERS found that it provided a prospectus to be aware of the causes of most LODD in public safety - mental barriers that play on one's self-conscience blocking clarity in making decisions on the fire ground. We wrapped up May with VEHICLE RESCUE REVIEW with a great attendance of 43 members. COMING UP in JUNE....HIGH-RISE FIREFIGHTING with classroom on Friday, June 22, and Hands-on, a choice of June 23rd or 24th. Only 60 openings available. Hands-on will be at Westmoreland Hospital west stair tower. It should be noted that this department is spending dollars on training, both the Situational Awareness Matters program and the up-coming High-Rise Firefighting Class. We are not filling these classes the way we should and we ask that you take advantage of these wonderful opportunities to prepare all of us for the responsibility we take on behalf of the community we proudly serve. Future Training: June: Water Supply & Pittsburgh St. Verizon Building; July: Fire Ground Ladder Placement; August: Rapid Intervention; September: Salvage Operations; October: Gas Meter Review; and November: Fire Scene Preservation. Reserve Members

The Department benefits by the established Reserve Membership Classification by having experienced and trained firefighters join our ranks especially during the week daylight hours. These experienced firefighters from other departments when working in and around us during the day can offer us additional necessary man-power during an actual incident. Reserve Members cannot be members of our individual companies, as our members cannot belong to more than one department. Reserve Members cannot vote or attend meetings. Reserve Members serve at the pleasure of the Chief. Reserve Membership will be restricted in number to 5 and not to exceed 10. Each year the Chief will review the prior activity of each Reserve Member and will determine if the Reserve Member shall remain on the reserve roster. Reserve Members shall not be affiliated with a Company and shall be designated by a 900 number which will start with 900 and end at 909. Reserve Members shall be listed on all Company Run Sheets as a Reserve member with name and number and may show up at any station to assist. Reserve Members may become Social Members of an individual Company if mutually agreed to by and between the Reserve Member and the Company. Reserve Members will be expected to supply their own gear; however, a special arrangement can be made on a case by case basis. All Reserve Members will be required to attend the next regularly scheduled Department Meeting to be introduced to the membership after their appointment by the Chief, and each January, the Chief will issue a reviewed roster to the Board of Control and Companies listing the current Reserve Members. Any Reserve Member who did not participate in the prior year will be cut from the roster.

REMEMBER....You cannot work together efficiently if you don't train together. This past year's effort in Department Training has been OUTSTANDING. The Citizens of our City should be proud of the dedication you have all exhibited!

Accountability & Decontamination

All Bunker Gear involved in actual fire incidents shall undergo **ON**-SCENE GROSS DECONTAMINATION. The Department will soon have the availability to have Bunkers Suits washed at a commercial facility. You will simply drop your suit off and pick it up 24/48 hours laters. The Department urges all to wash gear regularly in accordance with the instructions that have been provided to the Captains and Companies. All personnel are responsible for their own gear. Everyone should have two (2) Accountability Tags. There will be a collection ring on each Engine on the driver's door. You may also tag in with a Command Officer stationed around an

"HOT ZONE" PROTOCOL

All Personnel on the Fire Ground are to be wearing Gear to include: COAT, HELMET, LONG PANTS, BUNKER PANTS, PROTECTED FOOTWEAR. If it is deemed that you are unsafe, you will be asked to leave the HOT ZONE, as well as all civilians and media.

DECONTAMINATION - PPE

The Fire Department has been working towards a solution to deal with PPE decontamination. The direction is moving to have a local-Greensburg Laundromat process Bunker Suits with Greensburg Fire Department equipment placed at the Laundromat. The plan is no more than a 48 hour turn-around on PPE dropped off by the firefighter. Through a substantial Grant, the Department is purchasing approximately 20 new Bunker Suits that will be distributed to those who are regular interior firefighters. It is hoped that most, if not all, Greensburg Firemen will have two sets of compliant gear as part of the new program in the near future.

SAFETY - SAFETY - SAFETY

The Department's emphasis on training goes hand-in-hand with Safety. Safety is this Department's first and foremost goal, EVE-RYONE MUST COME HOME SAFE. The safety rules are not only the rules of the department, but that of the City of Greensburg. Basic rules are: SEAT BELTS MUST BE WORN | PPE ALWAYS: type when appropriate Bunker Suits, Hoods, Helmet, Eye Protection, Gloves, Chain Saw Chaps, Hard Hat, Face Shield, Hi-Vis Class II when in traffic. These items are an example of and not just limited to these. Everyone knows what to do. Violations of the policies regarding the Department Safety Mandates will be a verbal warning for the first offense and suspension and/or expulsion for any offense thereafter. It is all about safety and you returning home. As the Chief said in the last department meeting, "The last thing we need is someone to be severely hurt or die because you feel you don't need to abide by the safety rules."

Apparatus Equipment Standardization

There was a fire incident recently where a hose stretch required the use of a 2.5" double female. Members were delayed in making the hose connection because the double female was not in the compartment where they expected it to be. This could have resulted in loss of life situation if it were under another set of circumstances. All Greensburg Engines are designed similar and are to be equipped and arranged based on a standard. All Companies are to do this. We are a Department and there are times others must assist another company. All Company Captains have been issued a guide to use in establishing compartmental standardizations. Everyone needs to do this. It's about being efficient.

Dress White Uniform Shirts

Members that received Dress White Uniform Shirts and those that worn the regulation badge of the Department, look exceptionally great. As the Chief says: "You got to look like a Team to be a Team". The Dress White Shirts looked very professional at "Hutch's" Memorial Service worn by those that did not dress in a Department Class A. They also looked nice at the Department's Annual Banquet after which, there was another order placed for those who neglected to take advantage of the first ordering go-around. The Dress White Shirt makes a strong statement of Greensburg Fire Department Proud!
